Subject: Sustainability Advisory Committee Interviews and Appointments

Executive Summary:

The Sustainability Advisory Committee was established to provide guidance to City staff and the City Council on implementing the City's Climate Action Plan (CAP) and related sustainability initiatives. The Committee will consist of five regular members and two alternates serving staggered four-year terms. To establish this structure, initial appointments will be divided between terms ending in 2029 and 2030. Following appointments, staff will organize the Committee's inaugural meeting to establish logistics and address initial administrative matters.

Recommendation:

Staff recommends that the City Council review the applications, conduct the interviews, and appoint candidates to fill the vacancies on the Sustainability Advisory Committee.

Background:

On November 12, 2025, the City Council approved the formation of the Sustainability Advisory Committee. The Committee was established to serve in an advisory capacity to City staff and the City Council on matters related to the implementation of the City's Climate Action Plan (CAP) and related climate-focused programs.

The Sustainability Advisory Committee is comprised of five (5) regular members and two (2) alternate members with staggered four-year terms. Because this is a newly established committee, the initial appointments will need to establish odd and even year staggered terms:

- Term ending 2029: three (3) regular members and one (1) alternate member
- Term ending 2030: two (2) regular members and one (1) alternate member

The City Clerk's Office listed the vacancies on the City's website and social media accounts soliciting applications. A total of twelve applications were received by the January 28, 2026, deadline from Madhuri Adettiwar, Manuel Beltran, Ben Cherry, Christ Dembiczak, Alex Hurd, Meera Jacob, Chirag Kathrani, John Larsen, Diya Malali, Lorena Perez, Jennifer Shuen, and Martin Waterhouse. One applicant, Daniel Shim, withdrew his application.

Fiscal Impact:

There is no fiscal impact associated with the appointment of committee members.

Alternative Option(s):

Recruitment can be reopened if there are insufficient qualified candidates.

Next Steps:

Upon appointment of committee members, staff will schedule the Committee's inaugural meeting to establish meeting logistics, including regular meeting dates and times, and address initial administrative matters.
