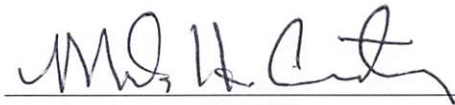
10. City Manager's and City Council Members' Comments / Matters Initiated

Public comment was received from We the People, and Greg Carr.

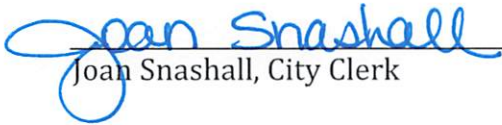
