Subject: Discuss and Approve Support and Participation in Unity Day 2026

Recommendation:

Teen Council should discuss and approve support and participation in Unity Day on Wednesday, October 21, 2026.

Background:

Unity Day, the signature event of National Bullying Prevention Month, has been recognized in the United States since 2011. To participate in Unity Day, individuals, schools, communities, and businesses wear or display orange to show support for students who have been bullied. One in five school-age children report being bullied at school.

Participation in Unity Day helps promote community awareness of the Teen Council and its role and impact on the community. By participating and wearing orange, the statement becomes a conversation starter, sending the supportive, universal message that bullying is never acceptable behavior.

Teen Council began supporting Unity Day in 2018. In previous years, the Teen Council has shown their support by wearing orange on Unity Day, posting photos on the City of San Ramon social media accounts to spread positivity and anti-bullying messages.

Subject: Intergenerational Programming Opportunities Discussion

Recommendation:

Teen Council should discuss opportunities for intergenerational programs that they can help facilitate or lead. The discussion may include the creation of an ad hoc committee to spearhead the item.

Background:

Through the success of the Senior Tech Days program, in which Teen Council members assist seniors with their technology questions, seniors and Senior Advisory Committee members have suggested additional opportunities to connect teens and seniors. Suggestions have ranged from playing Mah-jong and billiards to a general game night.

While Senior Tech Days are scheduled mid-morning on days that the Alcosta Senior and Community Center is open and Teen Council members are not in school, additional programs do not necessarily need to follow this pattern. The time and location should be considered in order to have the greatest impact for the community. The addition of a game night may be of interest to a different segment of the population, with their own transportation abilities. Additionally, partnerships could be considered for offering activities at one of the local Adult 55+ living communities such as Sunny Glen, Valley Vista, or Deer Creek 55+ apartments.

Subject: Discuss and Approve Senior Tech Day Dates, Topics, and Flyer

Recommendation:

Teen Council should review, discuss, and approve the proposed topics and dates for Senior Tech Days at the Alcosta Senior and Community Center.

Background:

The Senior Tech Day program has been successful in meeting the needs of seniors with technology questions for many years. The tech days feature 15-minute appointments in which seniors can bring their personal electronic devices, such as phones, tablets, and laptops, and have teen volunteers help them troubleshoot issues or learn new features of their devices. The window of time between 10:00am and 12:00pm has been most successful, as most seniors have arrived by 10:00am and those who take part in the congregate meal program often arrive early before the noon mealtime. To continue this successful partnership, staff recommends the Teen Council consider the suggested dates, which take into consideration days that students do not have school and when the Alcosta Senior and Community Center is open.

In addition to drop-in tech support, the following topics were recommended and approved at the May 19, 2026, Regular Teen Council meeting to be general presentations during Senior Tech Days.

Presentation Topics:

- **Calls & Messages:** How to save a contact, send a text message, save photographs from messages, receive a call, and start & end calls
- **Video Calls:** How to use Face Time, What's App, & Zoom. How to set up an account. How to start a call, join a call, and end a call.
- **Avoiding Spam:** How to unsubscribe from emails, using call filters to block spam, how to spot spam text messages and emails.
- **Scam Awareness:** Identify current tactics being used and how to avoid them. Potential to collaborate with SRPD
